All in the Graves Shall Come Forth (John 5:28-29)

Introduction:

- 1. In John 14:3 Jesus said to His disciples, "I will come again."
- 2. The Lord spoke these words to comfort the troubled hearts of the disciples.
- 3. If the Lord's return encouraged the disciples, it will encourage us as well.
- 4. Some special events will take place when Jesus comes back.
- 5. In our lesson we are concentrating on one event that Jesus mentioned in John 5:28-29 -- "all that are in the graves shall hear His voice, and shall come forth."
- 6. To illustrate why we need to study this subject,:
 - a. some members of the church in Corinth said that *"there is no resurrection of the dead"* (1 Corinthians 15:12)
 - b. two false teachers, Hymenaeus and Philetus, claimed that *"the resurrection is past already"* (2 Timothy 2:16-18).

Discussion:

- I. LET US FIRST ESTABLISH THE FACT THAT THE DEAD WILL BE RAISED
 - A. John 5:25
 - B. Romans 8:11
 - C. 1 Corinthians 6:14
- II. LET US NEXT ESTABLISH WHEN THE DEAD WILL BE RAISED
 - A. The Scriptures teach that the resurrection will occur "at the last day."
 - 1. John 6:39-40, 44, 54
 - 2. John 11:24
 - B. The resurrection will precede the judgment that will occur when Jesus returns.
 - 1. John 5:28-29
 - 2. 1 Thessalonians 4:16
 - 3. Revelation 20:12-13
- III. FINALLY, LET US ESTABLISH SOME ADDITIONAL DETAILS THAT RELATE TO THE RAISING OF THE DEAD
 - A. Both "the just and the unjust" will be raised (Acts 24:14-15).
 - B. From 1 Corinthians 15:35-44 we learn that the resurrected body will be a spiritual body that pleases God (Philippians 3:20-21).
 - C. According to Philippians 3:8-16, looking forward to the resurrection should affect the way we live.

Conclusion:

- 1. Although no one knows when, Jesus will come again.
- 2. When He returns, the dead will be raised, and everyone will be judged.
- 3. Perhaps this will help us to better appreciate why Jesus said that we are to "watch" and "be ready" for His return.
