## Identifying the Church

Introduction:

- 1. We are presently studying 13 great themes that the Bible addresses.
- 2. In our last 3 lessons we covered passages that relate to the following subjects:
  - a. "obeying God"
  - b. "the plan of salvation"
  - c. "a case of conversion."
- 3. When a person obeys the Lord's plan of salvation something very special occurs -- the Lord adds him/her to His church (Acts 2:47).
- 4. For our tenth great Bible theme we are concentrating on "identifying the church."
- 5. Specifically, we are examining the church's builder, its name, its head, its unity, and its purity.

## Discussion:

- I. THE CHURCH'S BUILDER
  - A. In a discussion that Jesus had with His disciples He identified Himself as the builder of His church (Matthew 16:13-19).
  - B. Additional verses identify Jesus as:
    - 1. "the foundation" (1 Corinthians 3:11)
    - 2. "the chief corner stone" (Ephesians 2:19-21).
  - C. Any church that was not built by Christ cannot be the church of the New Testament.
- II. THẾ CHURCH'S NAME
  - A. In the New Testament we read about various "churches" [congregations] in different locations (Revelation 1:11).
  - B. Scriptural expressions for the church include:
    - 1. "the church of God" (1 Corinthians 1:1-2)
    - 2. "the church of the living God" (1 Timothy 3:15)
    - 3. "the church of the firstborn" (Hebrews 12:23).
  - C. One particular expression used in Romans 16:16, "the churches of Christ," draws special attention to the church's builder, Christ.
- III. THE CHURCH'S HEAD
  - A. The New Testament clearly identifies Christ as the head of the church.
    - 1. Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:23
    - 2. Colossians 1:18
  - B. Because Christ is the church's head we must follow the admonition given in Colossians 3:17.
- IV. THE CHURCH'S UNITY
  - A. Just before He was arrested Jesus prayed that His followers would be one (John 17:20-21).
  - B. The platform for achieving the Lord's request is revealed in Ephesians 4:3-6.
- V. THE CHURCH'S PURITY
  - A. When a person is saved and added to the Lord's church he is washed, sanctified, and justified (1 Corinthians 6:11).
  - B. The Lord wants His church to remain pure (Ephesians 5:25-27).
  - C. The Lord's blood continues to cleanse His followers who walk in the light and confess their sins (1 John 1:7, 9).
