## Conversions in Acts

## "Faithfulness"

## Introduction:

- 1. In Acts 1:8, Jesus gave the apostles a specific plan for carrying the Gospel to *"all nations"* (Matthew 28:19-20).
- 2. Throughout Acts, Luke showed how the Lord's plan was implemented.
- 3. As he did so, Luke wrote about a number of conversions that occurred in various areas.
- 4. Studying these conversions helps us understand how we become Christians today.
- 5. As Luke wrote about the spread of Christianity in the first century, he also addressed a number of responsibilities that the Lord has given to His people, including "faithfulness."

## Discussion:

- I. PASSAGES WRITTEN PRIOR TO ACTS INDICATE THAT BLESSINGS ARE IN STORE FOR GOD'S FAITHFUL PEOPLE
  - A. (Psalm 31:19-24) David wrote about God's blessings for "the faithful."
  - B. As Jesus spoke about the judgment that will take place when He returns, He showed how His faithful followers will be blessed (Matthew 24:44-47; 25:14-23).
- II. IN ACTS, LUKE RECORDED A NUMBER OF PASSAGES THAT RELATE TO FAITHFULNESS
  - A. He recorded examples of the Lord's people being faithful.
    - 1. The Christians in Jerusalem were faithful (Acts 2:42, 46).
    - 2. Peter and John were faithful (Acts 4:15-20).
    - 3. The apostles were faithful (Acts 5:40-42).
    - 4. Stephen was faithful (Acts 7:54-60).
    - 5. Paul was faithful (Acts 14:19-22).
    - 6. Paul and Silas were faithful (Acts 16:22-25).
  - B. He also recorded instructions that emphasize faithfulness.
    - 1. (Acts 11:19-23) When Barnabas went to Antioch, he exhorted the Christians there to *"cleave unto the Lord."*
    - 2. (Acts 14:21-22) Paul and Barnabas exhorted Christians in various cities *"to continue in the faith."*
- III. FAITHFULNESS IS ALSO ADDRESSED THROUGHOUT THE NEW TESTAMENT
  - A. (1 Corinthians 4:2) Faithfulness is the main requirement of stewards.
  - B. The Lord will bless His faithful followers with:
    - 1. "a crown of life" (Revelation 2:10)
    - 2. "rest" (Revelation 14:13).
