Keeping Ourselves Unspotted from the World

(Lesson 40)

Introduction:

- 1. According to James 1:27, "pure and undefiled religion before God" includes "keeping ourselves unspotted from the world."
- 2. In addition to teaching us to remain unspotted from the world, God has provided numerous instructions in His Word that will help us to do so.
- 3. In this lesson we are concentrating on the Lord's instruction in Matthew 5:9 for His followers to be "peacemakers."
- 4. To help us appreciate the seriousness of this subject, let us first show . . .

- I. HOW GOD FEELS ABOUT "PEACE" AND "CONFLICT"
 - A. David showed how God feels about "peace" in Psalm 133.
 - B. Solomon showed how God feels about "conflict" in Proverbs 6:16-19.
 - C. When we understand how God feels about "peace" and "conflict," perhaps we can more fully appreciate why . . .

 - E. To help us understand what is involved in pursuing peace, let us consider . . .
- III. TWO BIBLE CHARACTERS WHO WERE PEACEMAKERS
 - A. Abraham was a peacemaker (Genesis 13:7-9).
 - B. Isaac, Abraham's son, was also a peacemaker (Genesis 26:17-22).
- IV. THE NEW TESTAMENT CONTAINS SOME SPECIFIC INSTRUCTIONS FOR PEACEMAKERS
 - A. Ephesians 4:1-3 ["endeavor"]
 - B. Philippians 2:1-4 [being considerate of others]
 - C. Colossians 3:12-13 [Christ is our example]
 - D. James 3:13-18 [pursue the right kind of wisdom]
 - E. 1 Peter 3:10-11 [controlling the tongue]

Conclusion:
